The Mission of the Chicago Public Schools Student Science Fair, Inc. (CPSSSF) as a nonprofit corporation is to foster Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) education among Chicago Public Schools (CPS) students by serving as a catalyst for the development of a cadre of STEM literate students; empowering these students to engage in science and engineering practices and providing these students with a public forum to present and have their work evaluated by professionals in specialized fields of study.

Student Science Fair Sponsors

School, Regional and City Science Fairs

Science Fair participation begins at the local school level with winners advancing to Regional fairs. Three hundred Regional winners exhibit at the Citywide Fair.



State and International Fairs

Each year 50 Citywide Fair winners, in grades 7-12, are selected to participate in the Illinois Junior Academy of Science (IJAS) State Exposition held in Champaign/ Urbana. Four of the top-scoring high school students are invited to participate in the prestigious International Science and Engineering Fair (ISEF).

Symposium and Essay Contest

The annual Symposium is a Student Science Fair feature at which high school students present their research findings to a panel of judges. Twenty finalists proceed to present their research papers at the IJAS State Exposition. Students in grades 7-12 may write a library research paper for the Essay Competition. Winners at the city level go on to compete at the IJAS Essay contest.

► Scholarships (\$1,000 and up)

Qualified graduating seniors, pursuing a major in science who have participated in at least one CPS Science Fair are eligible to apply for a scholarship. Since 1956 CPSSSF has awarded scholarships to more than 1,800 CPS seniors.

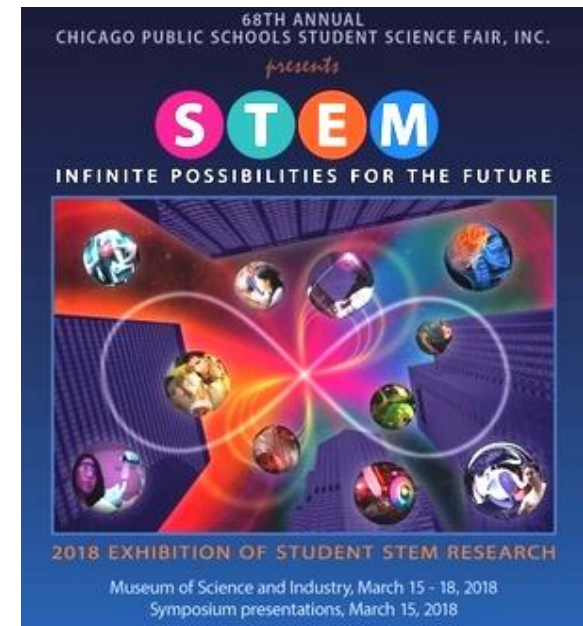
► Special Awards (\$50 - \$1000)
