The Mission of the Chicago Public Schools Student Science Fair, Inc. (CPSSSF) as a nonprofit corporation is to foster **Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM)** education among Chicago Public Schools (CPS) students by serving as a catalyst for the development of a cadre of STEM literate students; empowering these students to engage in science and engineering practices and providing these students with a public forum to present and have their work evaluated by professionals in specialized fields of study.

## Student STEM Exhibition Sponsors

## School, Regional & Citywide STEM Exhibitions

STEM Exhibition participation begins at the local school level with winners advancing to Regional Exhibitions. Three hundred Regional winners exhibit at the Citywide STEM Exposition.



## State and International Fairs

Each year 50 Citywide STEM Exhibition winners, in grades 7-12, are selected to participate in the Illinois Junior Academy of Science (IJAS) State Exposition held in Champaign/ Urbana. Four of the top-scoring high school students are invited to participate in the prestigious International Science and Engineering Fair (ISEF).

## Symposium and Essay Contest

The annual Symposium is a STEM Exhibition feature at which high school students present their research findings to a panel of judges. Twenty finalists proceed to present their research papers at the IJAS State Exposition. Students in grades 7-12 may write a library research paper for the Essay Competition. Winners at the city level go on to compete at the IJAS Essay contest.

#### ► Scholarships (\$1,000 and up)

Qualified graduating seniors, pursuing a major in science who have participated in at least one CPS STEM Exhibition are eligible to apply for a scholarship. Since 1956 CPSSSF has awarded scholarships to more than 1,800 CPS seniors. Scholarships in the minimum amount of \$1,000 are encouraged and will be named in honor of the donor. 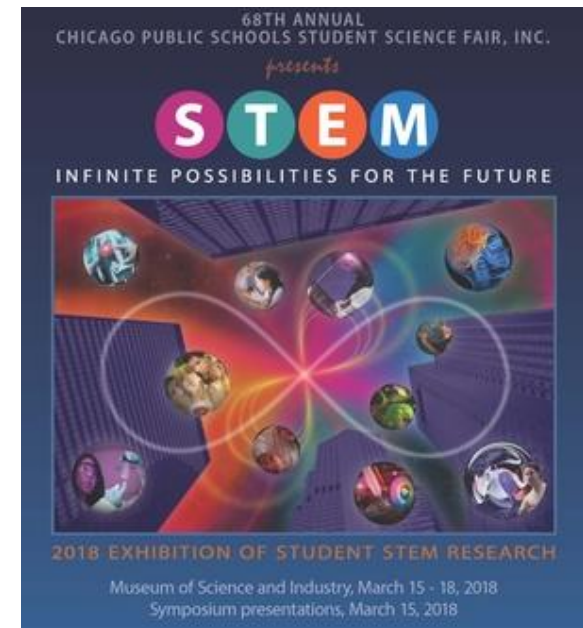
#### ► Special Awards (\$50 - \$1000)
